

STANDING ORDER OF THE SACRAMENTO SUPERIOR COURT

No. SSC-06-4

ORDER: RULE 243.20 DISQUALIFICATION

Under California Rule of Court, Rule 243.20(b)(3) an attorney is prohibited from serving as a temporary judge, "[i]f in a family law or unlawful detainer case, one party is self-represented and the other party is represented by an attorney or is an attorney." Rule 243.20(b) provides, however, that the presiding judge may waive limitations such as those listed above for good cause.

I have determined that the limitations set forth in Rule 243.20(b)(3) would seriously impair the court's ability to continue operation of its successful settlement conference program by limiting the types of cases in which pro tem judges may sit. Accordingly, I hereby find that good cause exists under California Rule of Court, Rule 243.20(b) to waive the limitation imposed upon the use of pro tem judges set forth in Rule 243.20(b)(3).
